# 1. Scope

This specification applies to District Material ID's 1002387 decals as illustrated.

# 2. Material and Decal Requirements

Refer to District Material Standard DECALMAT7.

### 3. Size

Labels shall be 5.0" high x 4.0" wide.

# 4. Color

UV resistant black opaque background with white reversed out copy with UV overprint clear.

# 300 Mhz Radio Procedure Checkilst In Case of Injury or Sickness 1. Use the orange emergency button on the 900 Mhz Radio if the injury, illness or situation involves PUD personnel and requires an aid car, paramedics or police. Any electrical contact requires calling an aid car and hence the use of the emergency button. Events or situations not requiring an aid car or police should be reported to ECC (Station 1) using either of the ECC 1, ECC 2 or ECC 3 Talkgroups. Do Not push the orange emergency button for non-emergencies. 2. Give the following information to the ECC dispatcher: Location of accident or injury - address and pole number. Number of injured persons. Do NoT USE INJURED PERSON'S NAME. Type of Injuries (burn, cut, fracture, unconscious, etc.) 'Type of emergency vehicles required (fire, police, aid car, etc.) If possible, assign someone to monitor radio until aid arrives. 4. After emergency aid vehicle leaves, radio ECC dispatcher and give name of facility to which any injured persons was taken.

# 5. Identification

The manufacturer's name or logo and the date of production shall be clearly marked near the bottom left edge of each decal. The District's Material ID number shall be clearly marked near the bottom right edge of each decal. Markings shall be in a small, legible font to avoid detracting from the decal's message. Refer to the illustration for the required locations for these markings.
